2. Current Resume and/or Bio:

If submitting as a team, a current resume and/or biography of all members should be provided. Please be sure to include complete contact information.

3. Project Rendering:

Artists should prepare illustration(s). Printed copy or CD/DVD/Flash Drive for review.

4. Support Materials (optional):

Artists may opt to submit any support materials representative of similar work/projects that may be applicable to the consideration and review of the proposal.

Cultural Arts Division/Grand Theatre Center for the Arts Staff will review proposals and identify a Finalist for the project award.
