Grand Theatre Center for the Arts

The Grand is an amazing facility thoughtfully developed as a **professional arts organization and educational center** in downtown Tracy. This municipal interdisciplinary arts center is the only one of its kind in the state of California, offering professional and community-based fine arts programming through arts education, exhibitions, performances and rentals of all kinds.

The Grand is owned and operated by the City of Tracy in strong partnership with the Grand Foundation. Together we are bringing exciting and diverse experiences to our community.



Arts Education Program

The Arts Education Program operates full-time with classes scheduled Monday through Saturday, excluding holidays. Classes are offered weekdays from 9:00 am – 8:00 pm, and on Saturdays from 10:00 am – 2:00 pm.

How do I register for a class?

To register for a class in person or by fax, complete the registration form located on page 28. Please include your name, phone number and the class number that corresponds to the class in which you wish to enroll. Bring the completed form to the Grand Theatre, patron services, located at 715 Central Avenue in historic downtown Tracy. Registration forms can also be faxed to 209.831.6271 or emailed to boxoffice@cityoftracy.org. Online registration is available at www.tracyartsandrec.com. All fees must be paid at the time of registration.

What if a class is full?

If you attempt to register for a class and find that it is full, you may ask patron services staff to place you or your child's name on a waiting list. If a space does become available in the class, patron services staff will contact the waiting list candidates in order of time on the list.

What is a resident discount and cost fee?

If your address has five digits or more, your home may still be outside of Tracy city limits. It is possible to live in one of three Tracy zip codes and still not live within the Tracy city limits. Families residing inside the city limits receive the resident discount. All others pay the non-residents fee. Call patron services if you are unsure.

Is financial assistance available?

Yes, financial assistance is available to qualified applicants. Participants may request a financial aid application from patron services staff and return it with the required forms of income verification. Applications must be accompanied by a registration form.

Can I drop-in the day of class to sign up?

Guests may not drop into a class without having officially registered. In order to participate in a class, you must be enrolled. Guests may visit patron services at the Grand Monday – Thursday from 8 am – 6 pm, or Friday from 8 am – 5 pm to register. Limited registration services are available on Saturdays through Arts Education staff. If a student registers the day of the class, they are advised to bring their receipt. Instructors cannot accept payments. All financial transactions and registrations take place through patron services at the Grand, online at www.tracyartsandrec.com or through Arts Education staff.

Is late registration available?

If space permits, class registration will be open for up to one week after the first day of class. After the first week of instruction, registration will be closed. Students are not allowed to register halfway through the class session or for a fraction of the class.

What if I withdraw from a class?

To obtain a full refund, you must complete the "Class Withdrawal Form" at least five business days prior to the start of class. If you decide within the first week of class that you are not satisfied, you may withdraw and receive a prorated refund or credit. All withdrawals or transfers will be charged a non-refundable \$5 transaction fee. These fees do not apply to withdrawals made on www.tracyartsandrec.com. Please allow 2 – 3 weeks to process a withdrawal and/or refund.

What happens if the class does not meet the minimum student enrollment?

Staff or the instructor may cancel the class. Students will be notified of the cancellation in advance and issued a full refund or class credit and will not be charged a transaction or refund fee.

What if I miss a day in class?

You will not receive a make-up session or a refund for the day you missed. By registering for a class, you assume the responsibility of attending class during the times and dates scheduled. The Grand Theatre Center for the Arts will only issue a make-up day or a prorated refund for classes canceled by staff or instructors. If a class is canceled by the instructor or an unforeseen circumstance prevents the class from taking place, the student will be notified.

Are art materials provided in classes?

The Grand Theatre Center for the Arts does provide shared art supplies and equipment for most visual arts classes. In some cases, instructors may request that students purchase specific materials outside of class. See class descriptions for more details.

Where is the nearest available parking?

Free parking is available on Central Avenue and 7th Street, as well as in nearby lots on 6th Street in historic downtown Tracy. Please observe city-posted signs to avoid parking tickets.

Are parents allowed to observe classes?

We encourage parents to wait outside the classroom to prevent overcrowding and distractions. Parents may relax in our lobbies or loggia while waiting. There are also windows on our classroom doors where parents can temporarily monitor their children at any time. In the event you feel you need to accompany your child in class, please call 209.831.6858.

Are food or drinks allowed in classrooms?

Food, drinks, candy and gum are not allowed in the classrooms with the exception of bottled water. Instructors will ask students to dispose of food, drinks, candy or gum if taken into the class.

Acrylic Painting

Introduction - Explore this exciting introductory class in acrylic painting with local artist Vince Walsh. Photography

Beginning - Beginning is intended for someone new to a dSLR camera. We get you started in a right direction, and include exposure controls, camera menus, lenses, and touch on composition. We explore the creative controls on the modern digital camera. Students will learn the basics of working with an adjustable camera, including f-stops, shutter speeds, "ISO" speed, lens, and more. Students focus may be action, portraits, or nature/landscape.

Intermediate - Students will go beyond the basic pointing and shooting of a digital camera. (single-lens reflex, 'dSLR,' models preferred) Students will explore more complex and sophisticated digital photography techniques.

Advanced - "Advanced" is usually driven very strongly by the wants and needs by the students enrolled – their specific situations, issues, or problems, and the individual interests will guide the direction and nature of this offered class. We will continue to explore further how the individual and combined interactive effects of exposure controls affect the image outcome.

Sgraffito Workshop

Sgraffito (in Italian means "to scratch") is a decorating pottery technique produced by applying layers of color underglaze to greenware pottery and then scratching off parts of the layer(s) to create contrasting images, patterns and texture and reveal the clay color underneath. We will use graphics and tracing paper to transfer your image onto your clay. We will practice on two "green" 4x4 tiles before working on two 8x8 tiles. We will also make a pendant just for fun!
