

Printmaking

This introductory course will cover the basic techniques and terminology for print making. We will use the press to produce monotype, relief and intaglio prints. Prints will come from existing plates and ones you create in class. No experience required. Supplies are included in the registration fee. The result will be a collection of your unique, one-of-a-kind prints, suitable for framing.

Photography

BEGINNING Beginning is intended for someone new to a dSLR camera. We get students started in a right direction, and include exposure controls, camera menus, lenses and touch on composition. We explore the creative controls on the modern digital camera. Students will learn the basics of working with an adjustable camera, including f-stops, shutter speeds, "ISO" speed, lens and more. Students focus may be action, portraits or nature/landscape.

INTERMEDIATE This class picks up where Beginning Photography leaves off. Students go beyond the basic point-and-shoot practice of a digital camera (single-lens reflex models preferred) through classroom discussions and hands-on with the camera in various locations around the Grand. Students will explore more complex and sophisticated digital photography techniques, including night photography and more in-depth on exposure concepts. Students will need to have taken a Beginning class already or have instructor approval.

ADVANCED This class continues the Intermediate Photography offering. The Advanced class is usually more driven by student's interests and needs. There are things that will be included - exploring light, whether "available" found around the building or "created" with use of off-camera sources and with tabletop "still-life" set-ups. Students will explore more complex and sophisticated photography techniques, delving into composing issues, more in-depth on exposure concepts, night photography and portrait ideas. Students will need to have taken an Intermediate Photography class already or have instructor approval.

Note: Students will need to bring their own camera with adjustable controls (no cell phone cameras please).

Beginner Wheel Throwing

Always wanted to try throwing a pot? Come give it a try in this relaxed environment. Join us as we learn the basics of using and throwing on a ceramic wheel. During the first two days of class, the instructor will provide demonstrations and students will create ceramic bowls and cylinders. Students will learn how to trim their projects on the third day of class, which will then be fired and ready for glazing on the last day.

Ceramic Hand Building

This class will cover hand building techniques used to create functional pottery forms. The class will focus mostly on slab building techniques using GR Pottery Forms, textured rolling pins and under glaze design. No previous experience needed. At the end, you will have created trays, mugs, vases, wall pockets and more.
